
A FINAL MESSAGE FROM THE OUTGOING PRESIDENT

Minutes of the 1981 Meeting of the Executive Council of the American Boccaccio Association: The Executive Council of the American Boccaccio Association met on December 28 at 7:00 p.m. at the Sheraton Centre Hotel in New York.

Paolo Giordano, Secretary-Treasurer of the Association, gave the financial statement for 1981:

It was agreed that voting for the new president will be done by mail ballot. The ballot will be mailed to the membership with the spring edition of the Newsletter.

A slate of three candidates was presented to the committee:
