

The "Allegory and Cosmos" team has been established in order to develop a methodological link between interpretive analysis and computer-entered research data in the field of medieval allegory. Common databanks are being developed in a joint effort by a number of scholars who make their own individual, though interrelated and mutually supporting, interpretive use of the accumulated material.

At this time, the team is concentrating its efforts on and is seeking grant support for its "Bibliography of Allegory, Plato to Spenser." The bibliography will comprise a listing of created allegories written in English (inc. Scottish), French (inc. Provençal, German, Italian, Spanish (inc. Catalan) or Latin between the years 800 and 1600, together with a limited listing of classical allegories which were influential in this period.

So far as chronological limits are concerned, the aim is to create a bibliography of allegory as a major form of human expression, both as manifested in literature (and, in a later phase of the project, as reflected in the visual arts) over a wide enough period of time to assess a complete cycle of rise, establishment, and fall.

Nonetheless, the broader aspects of the definitions of allegory, are not neglected since an essential aspect of the history of the genre is doubtless the history of what men thought it to be. Thus incorporated into the text is a lexicon of the definitions of allegory corrent within this period. At the same time the development of a motif index reflects the position that content as well as form plays an essential role in the identification of the allegorical mode.

The Director of the project is McGill professor, Paul Piehler. Among the McGill members of the research team are André Michhlski (Catalan and Spanish), Horst Richter (German), Pamela D. Stewart (Italian: Boccaccio).


PUBLICATION ANNOUNCED

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


