Toronto to Publish Volume One of Lectura Boccaccii

The Univ. of Toronto Press has accepted for publication the first volume of our *Lectura Boccaccii* series, edited and with an introduction by Elissa Weaver, Univ. of Chicago. The volume will include readings of the *Decameron* Proem, the Day One Introduction, and the *novelle* of the First Day. Contributors are Robert Hollander, Thomas Stillinger, Franco Fido, Marga Cottino-Jones, Pamela Stewart, Ronald Martinez, Dante Della Terza, Janet Smarr, Michelangelo Picone, Victoria Kirkham, Pier Massimo Forni, and Millicent Marcus. We are delighted to have found a publisher for this important book, which will represent a significant contribution to Boccaccio studies in North America. We'll keep you posted as the publication date draws near.

A special thanks to those of you who have made financial contributions to the Association to help underwrite this project. A total of \$435 was collected, which will be forwarded to the Press.

Minutes of the Annual Meeting

The annual meeting of the American Boccaccio Association was called to order at 10:15 a.m. on Tuesday, December 30, 1997 in the Elgin Room, Sheraton Centre Toronto, with Michael Sherberg, president of the Association, presiding.

Prof. Sherberg began by reviewing the Association's financial situation. As of December 15 the Association had a bank balance of \$1341.81, of which \$435.00 consisted of contributions toward publication of the *Lectura Boccaccii* series. Prof. Sherberg announced that negotiations continue for publication of volumes one and two of the series, and that further information should be forthcoming.

Following these announcements, two papers were presented: "Fiammetta versus Dioneo in *Decameron* 1, 4, and 5," by Marilyn Migiel, Cornell Univ., and "Of Amazons and Painted Pictures: Redactors, Illustrators, and the Quattrocento Reception of Boccaccio's *Teseida*," by Suzanne C. Hagedorn, Coll. of William and Mary. A third scheduled presenter, Roberta Ricci, was unable to attend due to a family emergency. A question-and-answer period followed the presentations.

There being no other business, the meeting adjourned at 11:30 a.m.
