WELCOME FROM THE NEW ABA OFFICERS:

Dear Friends in Boccaccio,

We hope this finds you all well at the start of 2024. After the election of June 2023, we are writing to express our gratitude and enthusiasm for the opportunity we have been given to serve the American Boccaccio Association as officers. For those of you who does not know us yet, we provide brief bios at the bottom of this message to introduce ourselves.

We have been working to plan the forthcoming three years of the ABA. Following the previous ABA's officers' mandate, we will offer a paleography seminar in 2024, this year scheduled to take place in Florence, Certaldo, and Rome from June 5-12. The announcement and application guidelines can be found at the end of the newsletter or on our website. Also, we would like to thank Professor Paola Ureni (CUNY, College of Staten Island) for helping us in the process with logistics and emails.

In 2023, the ABA hired a web designer, Ana Piore, to redesign and improve the functionality of the ABA's official website. The revamped site will serve as a hub where the ABA can publish in real time all relevant information about upcoming events, the Association prizes, provide links to external projects, and many other features. 2024 marks the 50th anniversary of our association, which was established in 1974 during the celebration of Petrarch's sixth death centenary at the Folger's Library. Hence, starting in spring 2024, we will have Zoom meetings with some previous ABA officers to bridge the old with the new through a revisitation of each decade of the American Boccaccio Association. This will create a shared oral history of the ABA thanks to the exchange of our memories and projection into the future. Keep an eye out for upcoming details posted on our listsery, Facebook page, and ABA website.

Moreover, 2025 will mark the 650th anniversary of Boccaccio's death. To celebrate appropriately this important event, we plan to hold our triennial international conference at the Newberry Library in Chicago, on September 18-20, 2025. More information will be become available during the current year, but in the meantime, remember to mark your calendars!

In the body of this Newsletter, you will also find announcements related to the organized Boccaccio sessions at the major professional conferences for 2024. As I thank you for renewing your membership for the year, I would like to reassert our commitment to have the Association put your dues to good use, especially by sponsoring the Velli Prizes, travel fellowships for graduate students, the Paleography Seminar, and the maintenance of the new website in years to come. The new membership rates reflect and support these important activities of the American Boccaccio Association.

We wish to express our gratitude to all ABA member for their continuing support of the *Lectura Boccaccii* series. Only four volumes are now missing, and we expect to get them published within the end of our mandate with the University of Toronto Press. Your contributions, both scholarly and monetary, are vital to this collective effort!

OFFICERS BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:

President: Elsa Filosa is Assistant Professor of the Practice in Italian at Vanderbilt University. She holds a Ph.D. in Romance Languages from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Her research focuses on Fourteenth century Italian Literature, with particular emphasis on Boccaccio, Petrarch, Dante. She published *Tre Studi sul De mulieribus claris* (Milan: LED Edizioni Universitarie, 2012), several articles on American and Italian journals, and three coedited volumes. In 2015-2016 she was awarded the Villa I Tatti Fellowship in Florence, where she did research for her book *Boccaccio's Florence: Politics and People in his Life and Work* (Toronto: University of Toronto Press, June 2022), winner of several prizes – Winner: Flaiano International Prize for Italian Studies; AATI Book Award for Literary, Critical Theory, and Cultural Studies; MLA Scaglione Prize for Italian Studies (Honorable Mention).

Vice President: Maggie Fritz-Morkin is Assistant Professor of Italian at UNC-Chapel Hill, where she teaches the works of Boccaccio in courses like Medieval Frauds and Contagion and Culture: Lessons from Italy. She has published numerous essays on visceral language in medieval Italian literature, and her book *Obscenity and Authorship in the Tre Corone* will be published by the University of Toronto Press. Before her current term as Vice President, she served the American Boccaccio Association as Secretary.

Treasurer: Sara Díaz is an Associate Professor of Modern Languages and Literatures at Fairfield University. Her scholarship centers on comedy, gender, and authorship in the works of the *Tre corone*, as well as in the volumes produced by the seventeenth century *virtuosa*, Margherita Costa. In addition to serving as the Treasurer of the American Boccaccio Association (2023-2026), she also serves as a Councilor (2023-2026) and Bibliographer (2023-2025) for the Dante Society of America, and as the MLA Regional Delegate for New England and Eastern Canada (2022-2024).

Secretary: Francesco Ciabattoni is Professor of Italian Literature at Georgetown University, where he is also Director of the Global Medieval Studies Program. He is Book Review Co-Editor for *Quaderni d'italianistica* and an Officer of the Dante Society of America. Prof. Ciabattoni's research interests include medieval and contemporary literature and the interplay with music. He has published *Dante's Journey to Polyphony* (Toronto, 2010), *The Decameron Third Day in Perspective: Volume Three of Lectura Boccaccii* (Toronto, 2014, edited with Pier Massimo Forni) and *La citazione è sintomo d'amore* (Carocci, 2016). He is the founder of http://theitaliansong.com/. His new monograph titled *Dante's Performance: Music, Dance, and Drama in the* Commedia will be published by De Gruyter in 2024.




PALEOGRAPHY SEMINAR

The American Boccaccio Association in collaboration with the Ente Nazionale Giovanni Boccaccio presents:

The 2024 Paleography Seminar June 5-12, 2024

The 2024 ABA paleography seminar will be on June 5-7 in Florence (Laurenziana, Riccardiana, and Nazionale Centrale); June 8-9 in Certaldo (Casa di Boccaccio and Medieval dinner); and June 10-12 in (Vatican and Corsiniana Libraries).

The Paleography Seminars is a series of intensive lessons taught in the major historical libraries of Florence and Rome by top paleographers in the field of Boccaccio Studies. The seminar includes methodological and practical components of Latin and vernacular paleography. The teaching program will include: propaedeutic online sessions in May; eight days in Italy (Florence, Certaldo, and Rome) in June, with regular classes in the morning and supervised study sessions in the afternoon; introductions to the major Florentine and Roman libraries; paleography activities on Latin and vernacular manuscripts, and transcription practice.




Participants must be ABA members and have good knowledge of the Italian language as the seminars will be conducted in Italian. The Seminar is open to scholars and graduate students; applicants should be affiliated with a North American university. Qualified applicants should send their CV and a statement which explains their interest in participating in the seminar (maximum 250 words) by March 15, 2024 to Paola Ureni at: paola.ureni@csi.cuny.edu

Seminars are taught by internationally renowned scholars: Irene Ceccherini, Marco Cursi, Teresa De Robertis, Claudia Montuschi, David Speranzi, Maddalena Signorini, and Stefano Zamponi

The program fee for the seminar is \$800 (USD) to be paid to the American Boccaccio Association upon notification of acceptance. Participants will receive notice of their acceptance by the end of March 2024. The American Boccaccio Association will provide two travel grants of \$250 each to graduate students. In addition to a CV and brief statement of interest, graduate students should also provide a brief description of their research project in the field of Boccaccio studies (including title, abstract, description of the project, contribution to the field, and selected bibliography).

VELLI PRIZES:

The **Giuseppe Velli Graduate Prize** for the best graduate student essay on a subject related to the life or works of Giovanni Boccaccio. The prize of three hundred dollars (\$300) will be awarded to a graduate student enrolled in any American or Canadian University, or by a recent graduate who earned an M.A. or Ph.D. during the year prior to submission. The winning essay will also be automatically considered for publication in <u>Heliotropia</u>, a forum for <u>Boccaccio</u> research and interpretation.

The **Giuseppe Velli Undergraduate Prize** of two hundred dollars (\$200) will be awarded for the best essay submitted by an undergraduate student in any American or Canadian University, or by a recent graduate who earned a B.A. during the year prior to submission.

The **Giuseppe Velli Creative Prize** of two hundred dollars (\$200) will be awarded for the best creative work, performance, or translation related to Boccaccio's works by a graduate or undergraduate student in any American or Canadian University. Materials can be submitted as digital recording or other media files.

Please note the following requirements for submission:

- The author's name should not appear on the essay's title page or elsewhere in the submission.
- Quotations from Boccaccio's works should be cited in the original language, and the format of the essay should conform to MLA Style Sheet guidelines.
- The essays should be no longer than 7500 words, including bibliography and other related material.
- The deadline for submission for all categories is June 1, 2024.
